
Join The Sixth Form Chaplaincy Team

St Michael's is linking up with **Istituto Salesiano Firenze Istituto,** a Salesian school in Florence, Italy.

30 students from Florence will be visiting and taking part in lessons at St. Michael's in November 2024.

30 of our students will then travel to Italy and spend time at their Salesian school. The opportunity is open to students in Year 8!

First preference will be given to those students participating in Faith in Action/Chaplaincy but anyone in Year 8 can apply.

If you are interested, please speak to your parents, a letter has been sent on Edulink. There are 30 places available.

Your parents will then need to <u>pay a deposit of £200 via</u> <u>ParentPay</u> to confirm your interest by Friday 4th October.

Remember, you must also have a good behaviour record and excellent attendance to be accepted on to any residential trips.

The Italian students will be staying in a hotel, not at your home.
