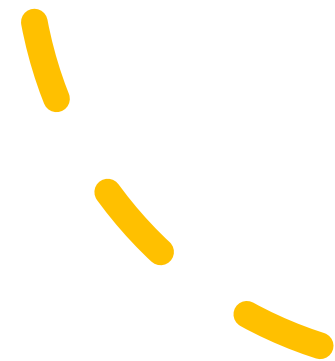

Last week, we learned about not always being able to see how our story ends whilst we’re in the middle of it.

Sometimes, we don’t see things as God sees them. We see things on a surface level, but Jesus sees our hearts. This passage is a reminder to keep checking if our ‘eyes are open’ to God’s work in the world around us. Dodo and her ten month old baby. Dodo dropped out of school in fifth grade and left home at the age of 13. She became pregnant while she was living on the streets. The father of her child is a bandit and is currently in jail. Staff from CAJED, CAFOD’s partner, found Dodo when she was living on the street and persuaded her to take part in the seamstress training. She is now reconciled with her parents and trying to make up for some of the mistakes she made in the past – and to help build a better future for herself and her child.
