Ms Corcoran commented "We are very proud of the students and are delighted they were given this opportunity, it was a beautiful performance." Mr Magnoff, who has a link to the choir, asked the Music Department to nominate students for Inner Voices and has been overseeing this programme since 2021. Julia, Irati and Paul have now been with the choir for several years and have performed at concerts at various prestigious venues in the UK and across Europe.

This Christmas our Inner Voices choir was fortunate enough to sing the carol after the King's Speech on Christmas Day. It was an incredible experience of the highest honour and it was difficult to keep it a secret from everyone we knew until 3pm on 25th December. The event took place in a gorgeous and small church called Fitzrovia Chapel and immediately upon entering we were faced with an overwhelming amount of cameras and nervous excitement. The process itself was singing the carol 'Once in Royal David's City' over and over again until the recording team were satisfied with how we sounded. It was a long day of filming, however, the end result sounded absolutely beautiful with all our harmonies between the parts and it was even more thrilling to watch ourselves sing on television right after King Charles on Christmas Day. #### Music Department News January 2025





A number of exciting things have been happening in the Music Department in recent months:

#### **Autumn Term Events**

#### National Youth Jazz Orchestra

Pupils from Year 9 and 10 took part in an exciting project with workshop leaders from the National Youth Jazz Orchestra on the 26th of November. Instrumental players learnt how to improvise using the chord sequence from 'I Got Rhythm' more commonly known when used in the 'Flintstones' theme tune in a traditional big band style. Ruby H-S Year 10 trombonist and currently studying GCSE Music commented "I enjoyed doing the improvisation and playing with my friends, especially when we were doing the iconic jazz riff. I also enjoyed relearning how to play

the 12-bar blues with the song 'Sunny Moon For Two'. We first started with the warm ups with improvisation, such as the 'squiggles' (which is just playing notes on an instrument randomly and quickly) and then solos were performed by members of the workshop -on the saxophone, trumpet, trombone, tuba and the clarinet. We then used more structure and played specific notes from the blues scale that fitted with the chords-great fun!"

#### Christmas Concert Video

A variety of pieces of music were prepared and recorded by the College Band, Brass Band and Junior and Senior choirs as well as the Samba Band with a Christmas theme including songs like "Let It Snow" and "Santa Claus Is Coming To Town". The Senior choir sang "Oh Holy Night" and the Junior Choir sang "A Christmas Melody" Pupils had great fun preparing and filming the video and the video is still available to watch via the College website under "latest news".

Special mentions to Aron V who managed to attempt and solve all problems presented in one workshop!











# What's been happening in the faith life of the school?


- Staff and students returned to school on Monday the 6th January – the Feast of the Epiphany
