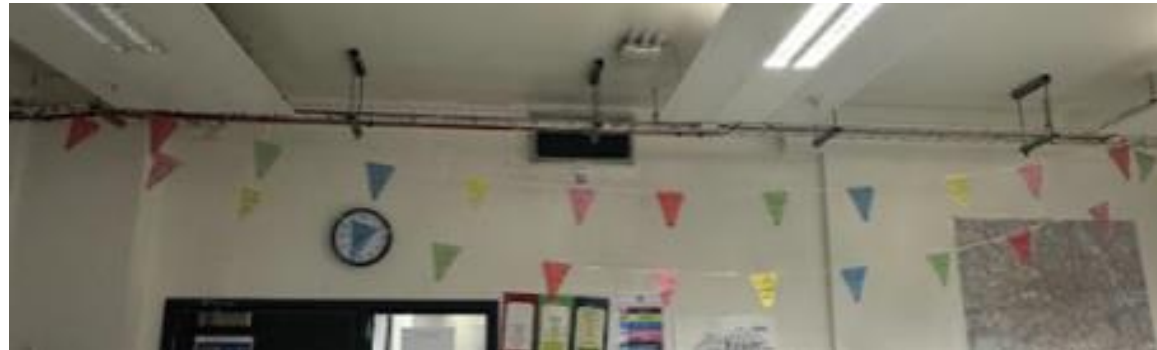

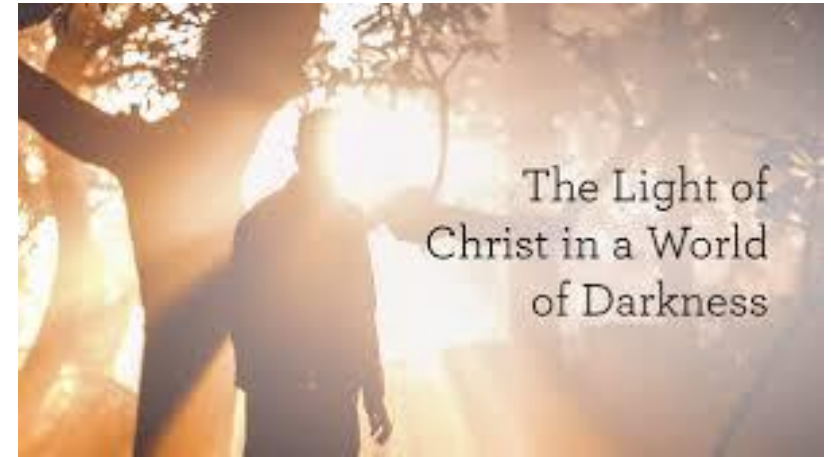


Prayerful intentions this week...

REMINDER: Seeing the School Nurse/First Aiders



- The school nurse/ first aiders in reception support students who become unwell, have an accident or become injured **during the school day**.
- The school nurse also supports students who have a long term medical condition and liaises with parents and doctors outside of school.
- The school nurse and first aiders **are not here to replace GP services**, if you have an ongoing problem your parent/carer needs to book a GP appointment, **you should not drop in to see the nurse**.
- During break or lunch students may take themselves to see the nurse/first aider **if they need immediate first aid**.
- Students will not be allowed out of lessons to see the school nurse **unless they have an appointment and have a note from the nurse for the appointment**.
- During lesson time **including immediately after break and lunch** students who need first aid/feel unwell **must go to their lesson** and their teacher will email the nurse/SLT on call/first aider to come to them.
- Students will be given **major mentions** if they go to see the nurse/first aider at the start of lessons rather than getting their teacher to call the nurse.




Lunch Time Expectations



To keep everyone safe and avoid disruption to lessons the following is expected of all students.

- Students are only allowed to laptop lockers during the first 10 mins of lunchtime.
- All students in Years 7-11 must line up to go into lunch and also at the end of lunch.
- The library in the main build and 6th form study area are for silent study/revision only. Students talking will be asked to leave and **a major mention will be given**.
- Students must only be in the designated area for their year group or canteen at lunch time.
- Students going to clubs must have a pass from their teacher, get to the club within 15 mins of lunch starting and should stay in the club for the whole of lunchtime.
- Any student found on corridors/staircases/in classrooms without permission **will receive a major mention**. The same goes for students at lockers after the first 10 mins of lunch.
- Bags and coats should not be left around the building or to reserve seats in the library etc. **Minor mentions will be given** if bags are found lying around.
- Students are not allowed to go and find teachers, if a teacher needs to see you they will give you a note. You can message your teacher on google classroom.
- Students must only go to their designated year group toilets - **major mentions will be given** if you are in a different year group toilet.
- In extreme temperatures or during heavy rain - students will be directed to the hall/gym/undercroft as appropriate.

Catholic Young Writer Award 2025

This annual Award for Catholic school pupils of secondary school age was launched by The Keys, the Catholic Writers Guild of England and Wales in the 1990s and has been flourishing ever since. It is now sponsored by the [Catholic Union Charitable Trust](#).

The winners are invited to the Annual Meeting of the Catholic Union, held each Autumn in London, to receive their prizes from the President, Baroness Hollins.

Theme for the 2025 Jubilee Year Award: Jesus Christ, Son of God



Imagine a friend has said to you: "I think Jesus was a great man, and wonderful moral teacher, but I do not accept that he is God."

Write a response to this, explaining why we know Jesus is who He claimed to be: our Saviour and Redeemer, promised from the beginning. To help you, here is a quotation from CS Lewis, the great Christian writer:

"A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said wouldn't be a great moral teacher. He'd be either a lunatic on a level with a man who says he's a poached egg or else he'd be the devil of hell. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse". (1952)

In your essay, you should make use of the Scriptures, especially the words of Christ Himself in the Gospels. You should also show evidence of having consulted the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* and some recent Papal teachings, eg from Pope St John Paul II, Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis.
