Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse". (1952)

In your essay, you should make use of the Scriptures, especially the words of Christ Himself in the Gospels. You should also show evidence of having consulted the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* and some recent Papal teachings, eg from Pope St John Paul II, Pope Benedict XVI and Pope Francis.
